Legislature Rejects 5% Pay Cut

The Legislature's joint budget conference committee rejected a new across-the-board pay cut for state workers Tuesday, June 16th. The 5% salary reduction had been proposed by Gov. Schwarzenegger to save \$470 million and preserve cash in the coming fiscal year's general fund budget. The legislative committee rejected the pay cut by a party-line vote, 6-4, with no Republican support. The measure was one of dozens under consideration to bridge a projected \$24 billion budget shortfall. Even with the committee's action, the pay cut and other rejected items could resurface as negotiations continue.

The 5 percent cut in salary would have been in addition to two-day-a-month furloughs already imposed on most state workers. Between the furloughs and the proposed pay cut, affected workers would have received 14.2 percent less pay than a year ago.

Democrats Fight Governor's Proposals:

The state budget panel, held by a majority of Democrats have called for 25% less cuts in State programs and are proposing \$1.9 billion in tax increases. The Governor said he will veto tax increase proposals and wants to achieve closing the \$24 billion deficit through his proposed budget reductions.

Chapter Elections:

The chapter elections, for all odd numbered chapters, are finally tabulated, and confirmed by elected representatives. The elected and/or nominated chapter representatives will serve a 4-year term, commencing July 1, 2009 and ending June 30, 2013. For the CCSO members who ran for positions but were not elected we thank you for wanting to be an active participant in this Organization.

CCSO appreciates the four Chapter Presidents who were not re-elected or chose not to run again. We bid a fond farewell to long time Chapter President of San Quentin Lt. Frank Cerecedes who was not re-elected but will continue to be an active force for CCSO at San Quentin. We also thank the former Chapter Presidents of NKSP Lt. Vincent Gonzales, Corcoran Chapter President Sgt. Anthony Morrison, and HDSP Chapter President Lt. Rebecca Ingwerson for their past service to CCSO. We know that these past Chapter Presidents will continue to be active CCSO members.

CCSO would like to acknowledge Lt. Calvin Campbell for his active participation as a Chapter President at Lancaster. Lt. Campbell recently stepped down for personal reasons. Lt. Campbell appointed Lt. Robert Valenzuela as the new Chapter President of Lancaster. We know Lt. Valenzuela will continue the good work of Lt. Campbell. Best of luck Lt. Valenzuela as the new LAC Chapter President.
